step 04	Acceptance Return the signed Letter of Offer and arrange payment of fees as indicated. Submit your application for homestay with ASCI, if you require homestay.
step 05	Confirmation of Enrolment Once payment is receipted and we receive your confirmation of homestay placement, we will issue a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) and a Confirmation of Appropriate Accommodation and Welfare (CAAW) letter.
step 06	Visa Submit your visa application and advise us as soon as it has been granted.
step 07	Preparation and Orientation Organise your travel details and advise us of your arrival date and time. Our Student Services team and the School will be in contact with some important pre- departure orientation information. Make sure you review this carefully.
step 08	Arrival into Australia Your school orientation will usually take place the day before school officially starts and you will be welcomed by ASC International and school staff.
